## Academic Route



• One of the main differences between academic study and vocational is that studying for A-Levels involves study across a variety of different subjects, whereas studying for a vocational qualification, although made up of a variety of components, is all aimed at one subject.

 Another difference is that A-Level assessment comes at the end of the course, rather than continuous assessment.
