Needs (P.I.E.S)	Services - These are the places and specialists Alfie and Sophia need to access to help them with their PIES needs.	Similarities	Differences
Physical (Example only)	Eyes — Optician	Both Alfie and Sophia have difficulties with their eye sight. They both need help with their vision and therefore need specialist support off an optician.	 Sophia needs to visit the eye specialist at Birmingham Children's Hospital as her condition requires an more specialist consultants to help her overcome sight problems relating to CHARGE syndrome. However, Alfie is able to visit the local opticians to get an eye test and sight prescription. His difficulties can be addressed with prescription glasses from a primary care service.
