

Funding Support for Mercian Trust Families

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Clicking the pink hyperlinks on the following pages will take you directly to the necessary sites.

1 - Help with food and essentials

You may want to:

- apply for an emergency support payment this could help pay for:
 - o food
 - clothes
 - essential items (for example, a washing machine or fridge)
- find a local food bank
- Black Country foodbank or vouchers should be made available by each school.

2 - Help to keep your home warm

You can:

- apply for funding to help keep your home warm
- apply for an emergency support payment this can help you pay for heating and other costs
- find out if you'll get the £150 council tax rebate to help with energy costs
- find out about the **Energy+ support resource** this provides help to prevent fuel poverty
- contact <u>British Gas Energy Trust</u> for grants and support even if you're not a British Gas customer

There is help with heating costs on the government's website:

- <u>Cold Weather Payment</u>

3 - Help to pay your rent

To help pay your rent, you can:

- apply for a discretionary housing payment (DHP)
- get advice from Money Helper

You may be eligible for benefits from the government. Their website will tell you all about:

• benefits you can get if you're on a low income

4 - Support if you are pregnant or have a child under 4

- find out what benefits you can get on gov.uk
- get Healthy Start vouchers from the NHS to help buy basic foods
- apply for an emergency support payment this can help pay for:
 - heating
 - o food
 - clothes
 - o nappies
 - o other essentials
- find out about personal budgets and direct payments for children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)

5 - Support if you have a child over 4

You can:

• find out what benefits you can get on gov.uk

If you're eligible, you can also:

- <u>sign up to the HAF (Holiday Activities and Food) programme</u> it's free for children and young people aged 5 to 16 who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals
- apply for free school meals
- get help with the cost of home to school transport
- apply for an emergency support payment this can help pay for:
 - heating
 - o food
 - o clothes
 - o nappies
 - o other essentials
- find out about personal budgets and direct payments for children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)
- Apply for an educational bursary for post 16 students via school:
 - See school website.

6 - Reduce your council tax

You can:

- apply for council tax reduction (CTR)
- find out about CTR if you have a disability
- find out if you'll get the £150 council tax rebate to help with energy costs

The council tax reduction (CTR) scheme has changed. You may be able to get <u>hardship support</u> if the changes mean that you are worse off.

7 - Water discounts and services

Find out about

- the discount scheme from Severn Trent Water
- the discount scheme from South Staffs Water (SSW)

SSW <u>community hub</u> can make sure you get extra help when you need it. You can also <u>compare their</u> tariffs to see what's right for you.

If you're having money problems, you can apply to the <u>SSW Charitable Trust</u>. They may be able to help towards the cost of your water bill.

If you're a care leaver, you can get a discounted tariff from SSW.

8 - Help if you are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless

Walsall Council Housing Team can offer help and support to you. You can contact them <u>by email</u>or you can <u>phone</u>.

9 - Financial help and benefits from the government

You may be able to get tax relief or financial support:

check what help you can get from HMRC

Find out more about the benefits you could get, including:

- benefits for families
- benefits if you're on a low income
- support if you're looking for work
- benefits if you're unable to work
- benefits if you have a disability or health condition
- help and support if you're a carer
- help you can get if someone dies

There's also advice from the government about:

- earnings and taxes
- <u>employment</u>

10 - Advice with debt and managing your money
