HEAD OF SCHOOL UPDATE



This week marked our second Assessment Week of the academic year, where students worked to complete assessments in their Core subjects. The focus of students, and their dedication was superb; even Dr. Badyal mentioned on her visit this Monday how impressive they were. Assessment Week prepares our students, in an age-appropriate and supportive setting, for the rigours of their later examinations, and I have been so pleased to see students revising, self-quizzing and testing each other during

Family Breakfast and Tutor Time. I believe we have the #HardestWorkingStudentsInSandwell, but that moniker can only have the veracity it does thanks to the support our children receive at home – thank you!

Last weekend, I received a wonderful message on the Academy's Facebook page (which I personally manage and respond on), containing an aerial image of the Academy site taken by drone! It was truly fascinating to behold our growth from this elevation, with the Specialist Teaching Block particularly drawing the eye. I can confirm that Miss Quamar is sourcing a frame, so the image can sit alongside all of my Liverpool memorabilia, in pride of place in my office. I thank Mr. Mark Shephard, father of Charlie Shephard (9C1) for sending the image to us; a Head of School Commendation will be heading home today. This week saw a Time for Tea with Gabriel Dhillon-Powell (10C1), who we were made aware had been continuing his amazing charity work in recent months. Gabriel has always, since Year 7, been heavily involved in charity work and helping others; it was great to catch up with him about his work with Black Country Women's Aid. In addition, during Assessment Week, we tend to see fewer students able to achieve three Star of the Lessons in a single day, but my congratulations (and a Head of School Commendation) to Mitchell Cooley (8A2) who managed it towards the end of last week – well done!

Speaking of our Phase 3 build, we have seen a number of visitors, in partnership with Wilmott Dixon, take time to survey the site. I am delighted to share that after the End User Weekly Meetings with Sandwell, Wilmott Dixon and our architects ADP have each started back with us, and will be with us every Friday from today. As ever, we are indebted to our Project Manager, Stewart Hills, who has been part of the Langley journey since the very start, overseeing the whole project. I for one am looking forward to working with him more frequently! As we progress, we will be able to share a more formalised timeline regarding construction, and how it might affect the site with mandatory closures. For example, we will share with you as soon as possible the dates that the steel for the new Phase will be delivered and erected over the Summer period.

This week, I had the pleasure of hosting Mr. Paul Cliff, one of our Governors. After arriving before 08:00, he spent a full couple of hours of his own time sharing the wisdom and skillset he has cultivated over an impressive career. We are extremely grateful to him, and his employers, Hadley Group, for graciously granting the time for him to visit with us.

Thursday saw, with Year 7, something that has become a lovely tradition in the Academy. Andrew Taylor, from the Gideons, joined us for an

assembly, and offered the opportunity to take a Gideon Bible – no doubt we will see Andrew this time next year! I am aware that our Sponsor (and avid reader of the Newsletter) Mr. Payne has performed a similar role for the Gideons near his residence, and would echo my deep thanks for them taking the time to share their faith with our students.

Additionally, I am thrilled that, during Ethos Week, our friends from Gas Street Church are hosting us as the base for our visit to Birmingham City Centre, spread across two days. I can attest to the difficulty to finding a place for 100+ children to eat their lunch in warmth and safety, and am so thankful for their kindness. I had the pleasure of visiting with them last week, and finalising the itinerary with Kids and Youth Pastor, James Leavy – they are so accommodating!

As a reminder, Ethos Week letters have been sent out (please ask your child to look in the depths of their bag for it), which outlines the plan for the week, for your particular year group. The consent form also needs to be sent back to us, as a necessity. In addition, we request a small, cash voluntary contribution to go towards transport and booking costs for the week – Mr. Gee, our Vice Principal, can speak at length about the cost of coaches – I thank those who have been able to support us. Our deadline for the latest raft of job adverts closed on Friday, with an enormous amount of interest due to the sharing from staff, parents and friends of the Academy. Our good friend Katherine Birbalsingh, the driving force behind the Michaela School in London, even endorsed our label as the 'Michaela of the Midlands'. Since this latest round of posts being advertised, we have even hosted over 25 prospective candidates for informal visits; a mere drop in the ocean of applications. I look forward to the shortlisting process and upcoming interviews.

Our wonderful Vice Principal, Mr. Mills, deputised for me at the latest Secondary Heads' meeting this week. I am always impressed by his commitment, professionalism and support, shown through my ten years of knowing him, and his time at Langley. In fact, he and Ms. Cox, a fellow Vice Principal, attend their Ambition Institute residential this weekend, as they trained for the next phase in their journey. I was thrilled to see Mr. Cox, Learning Consultant in Geography, attended a similar event last weekend, and Miss Hicks, our PLC in Year 9, continued her development with the NASUWT union. I thank all staff who go above and beyond in the pursuit of learning (which ultimately helps our students the most).

Before the end of this week's address, I must pay a special tribute to Mrs. Gaur, one of our founding members. I learned that this week marks 15 years since she started at Q3: beginning at Dartmouth, transitioning to Q3 Great Barr, and then embarking on our journey at Langley. 
