HEAD OF SCHOOL UPDATE



This week, a spotlight was shone onto something that has become the platform of the 21st Century – social media. As an Academy, we harness social media in much the same way that companies used radio over print, television over radio: the most effective means to deliver a message to our target audience, you. We have seen engagement with our social media sky rocket over the years, but these benefits are the sun-soaked tip of an iceberg that

has a mass of sinister, shadowy, corruptive influence below the surface.

This week, our Assistant Vice Principal for Behaviour, Mr. Karim, supported by a range of colleagues, produced (with the support of Mr. Dhaliwal) a powerful video message about the pernicious, insidious impact that social media is having on the hearts and minds of our children. I urge all of you to access and listen to the core message – unfiltered and unmonitored access is having a wholly negative impact on your children. Your children are living their lives on the platform, and its unregulated nature means that they are coming into contact with inappropriate content, explicit images and videos, racist abuse (and all other forms of discrimination) and most worryingly, contact with complete strangers – faceless personas that could be anyone. As an Academy, we solve the problem at source – we lock all phones away, so this plague cannot infect our daily lives. We have seen this week that parents and carers are allowing their children to live double lives (in many cases, extremely concerning ones) with no oversight or intervention. I echo the sentiment of the video – act now; save your children.

Last week saw a dramatic punctuation mark to the end of the week, as Thursday's wonderful extra-curricular sports activities were interrupted by a painful injury to Gabriel Capper-Steventon (7C2). I was so proud of Gabe's stoicism and bravery as he dealt with a broken arm; I would like to pay tribute to Mr. Davis, Mrs. Gaur, Mr. Karim and all other staff for their support. I should also thank Mrs. Tite, who was in attendance to collect her son Charlie (9L1) from Cadets: she offered support as an offduty paramedic! I reflected on what a small world it is when one of the arriving paramedics was the father of a Year 11 student, too!

This Thursday, we had several colleagues observing the end of Ramadan with their Eid al-Fitr celebrations — Eid Mubarak to all! I have to express my awe and respect to the tremendous show of faith displayed by staff and students this month — I even heard that one Muslim colleague who is not able to fast will even be able to enjoy their first ever Eid celebration with a family this week (following all guidelines, of course) — a wonderful example of the generosity of spirit that exists in our Academy, regardless of faith or background.

Racism is prevalent in our local community, and has touched us on occasions in our time. I look forward to seeing the conversations develop, support offered and progress made in this vitally important area.

This week, I attended the PACT AGM; I was so impressed with the professional manner with which PACT is run by our volunteer parents and carers. My thanks to the current leadership of Ms. Hudson (chair), Mrs. Easton (Treasurer), Mrs Purewal (vice chair) and those who set the foundations in place — Mrs. Irish, Mrs Bowen, Ms. Stokes and many more. We did publish Parents' Evening 5 letters this week, where you will be able to speak with your child's Core Learning Consultant. Though the government roadmap might have allowed a physical event, in the planning stages, we were not certain, so this Parents' Evening 5 will, like others this year, take place over the phone. I thank you for the support of all of our parents and carers.

Our Year 11 students have outdone themselves this week, managing 100% attendance for the first week of their Mock Exams.
