

1	Exploring the basics of photography and the impact of lighting. How to develop a successful GCSE Photography portfolio.	To acquire knowledge of a DSLR camera body and the purpose of different lenses. They will be able to practice using different aperture settings and exploring the resulting effects on photographs. Similarly, to seeing the effects of different apertures, lighting will be explored to see how different lighting can affect the atmosphere and narrative of a photograph.
